

Sports Funding 2015-16

DFE Sports Funding is designed to help provide additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education and Sport offered by this school and schools in general.

We use the funding to:

- increase the already substantial PE and Sports activities offered by the school
- make sustainable improvements to provision that will be available for future years

In 2015/16 Osbaldwick Primary School received £9,346 in sports funding. The money was spent in the following ways:

Overall Impact of funding

- A greater number of pupils are more engaged in sports activities throughout the year
- A greater number of pupils who do not normally choose to access sporting activities are doing so in a non-competitive atmosphere.
- A wider range of clubs with higher skill levels are available for pupils with particular talents in football and rugby
- Teachers and teaching assistants have a higher level of skill when providing sporting activities to benefit pupils engagement
- Resources are targeted to support a wider range of sporting PE activities including cycling.
